Since 2017, Ir Dr Wong has been putting a great deal of effort in developing various robotic and Artificial Intelligence (AI) applications for the construction industry. He recevied his Doctor of Philosophy Degree at City University of Hong Kong, specializing in adopting AI to optimize energy consumption for large scale central air conditioning system.

Ir Dr Wong is very active in public and community services. Formerly Senior Vice President of Market Transformation and Development, North America for the US Green Building Council (USGBC) Kimberly spent 18 plus years leading and directed USGBC's 40 local community advancement teams (Chapters) along with members, volunteers and emerging professionals delivering on the USGBC mission to improve the quality of life for all through more sustainable buildings, cities, and communities worldwide.

Under her leadership, the values of service and respect undergird people-centric strategies to provide the council and the movement with a strong foundation of stakeholder-based support. Kimberly's love for people stems from a solid base of faith and family. She is a minister and past leader of women's and youth ministries for Harvest United Ministries, Clinton, MD (United Churches of Jesus Christ - Apostolic.)

Kimberly is a movement builder who developed the award winning Greenbuild International Conference & Expo. Part market development platform and part tent revival, Greenbuild was created to propel thought leadership and be the epicenter for sustainability in the built environment and beyond. Under Kimberly's guidance, Greenbuild became the largest sustainability conference in the world with an annual operating budget exceeding \$15 million, 28,000+ attendees, 1500 exhibitors and sponsors, 700+ global speakers, and 500+ media outlets. In 2014, Greenbuild was acquired by Hanley Wood LLC (and later Informa) to grow the show and expand it globally.

Recognizing the journey of women in the built environment, Kimberly fights for gender equality. She created, and lead, the global Women in Green (WIG) mentorship programs, summits, and events in the US, Brazil, China, Europe, India, and Mexico.

Focusing on building community power, Kimberly is chair of the board of directors for Groundswell, a nonprofit community solar and energy equity leader. She also serves on the board for PaceNation and Elevate Energy as the diversity, equity, and inclusion thought leader.

Grounded in her belief in the power of face to face convening she has shared her people first visioning on various hospitality sector advisory boards to include Starwood Hotels, Marriott International Hotels, and the convention and visitors' bureaus in New Orleans, Atlanta, and Denver.

Kimberly has been recognized with numerous awards including the GB&D magazine 2018 Women in Sustainability Leadership Award (WSLA). In April 2011, Kimberly received prestigious recognition as the White House Champion of Change for Clean Energy. She was also named in Glamour Magazine's 70th Anniversary 70 Women Leaders to Know in Sustainability.



Ar. Donald CHOI, JP

Executive Director and Chief Executive Officer, Chinachem Group

Mr Donald CHOI works globally as architect and developer for over three decades and is familiar with both public and private projects. He has worked in North America, Asia and China, including Hong Kong listed companies, with vast in-depth knowledge in the real estate development and investment industry. He believes in the power of design and architecture to empower society. Clients have included Hong Kong Government, Airport Authority, Mass Transit Railway Corporation, Urban Renewal Authority, Public Works Canada, British Columbia Buildings Corporation, NGOs and the private sector.

Currently, he is the Chief Executive Officer of Chinachem Group. Before, he was the Managing Director of Nan Fung Group, Director of Foster and Partners, and the Authorized Person (Architect) for the Hong Kong International Airport Passenger Terminal (HKIA Silver Medal Winner) and many infrastructure projects at Chek Lap Kok. The airport was awarded the Top Ten Construction Projects in the World and has won numerous awards including the Best Airport in the World since opening in 1998.



Dr WEI Qing-peng

Deputy Director, Building Energy Research Center, Tsinghua University

As the team leader of study on energy efficiency in commercial buildings, Dr. Wei established an on-line energy monitoring and benchmarking system of commercial buildings through detailed metering. By this monitoring and benchmarking system, current situation, characteristics and saving potentials of energy consumption for HVAC, lighting, office appliances in commercial buildings are clearly disclosed with real time energy consumption data. Therefore, Dr. Wei develops data-driven model and data mining methodology for energy consumption in commercial buildings.

Dr. Qingpeng Wei received his B.Sc., M.Sc., and Ph.D. degrees in building services engineering from Tsinghua University. Dr. Wei initiated his research in building energy efficiency (BEE) in 1996. And he was involved in lots of international cooperation projects on BEE, including UNDP-GEF funded CHINA End-use Energy Efficiency Project, World Bank funded CHINA building Energy Efficiency Study etc. Currently, he is leading a research team on energy efficiency in large-scaled commercial buildings which have the highest electricity use intensity among all kinds of buildings in China. Dr. Wei and his team have accomplished energy diagnosis in more than 500 buildings in China, Hong Kong SAR, USA and Japan, including 20 office buildings of central government, Beijing Olympic venues, etc. Dr. Wei was also invited to visit and investigate energy data of commercial buildings in France, Belgium, Netherland, Germany, etc. In addition, with his effort, low-cost retrofitting techniques including control strategy optimization, energy efficiency oriented FDD, have been implemented in about 100 commercial buildings which obtained more than 30% of energy savings. Meanwhile, he is involving deeply in IEA ECBSC annex 53 as a subtask leader studying on human behavioral impacts on total energy use in office buildings.



Mr Lee SAUERWALD

Executive Director, Corporate Services, Uniting Communities Incorporated

As a Fellow CPA MBA, Lee specialises in social, environmental and financial sustainability while undertaking executive responsibility for Uniting Communities Corporate Services portfolio. This includes Property, Investment, Financial, Procurement, Fleet and Carbon Reduction.

Lee has led Uniting Communities to be Certified Carbon Neutral since 2015 - the first Australian Registered Charity and first South Australian organisation to do so. As the Inaugural Ambassador and a Founding Partner of Carbon Neutral Adelaide, Uniting Communities have been awarded the Business Leadership Award for their leadership and advocacy in reducing carbon emissions.

The multi-award winning U City is Uniting Communities latest innovation: a 6 Star Green Star Carbon Neutral vertical village bringing together residential, social, commercial and community services to create a vibrant, inclusive and sustainable community thriving in the heart of Adelaide.

Uniting Communities most recent ambition is to reach Net Zero carbon emissions by 2035 and they invite all businesses and organisations to join them in achieving their own net zero targets.



Dr Edward LEUNG Man-fukPresident, Hong Kong Association of Gerontology

Dr. Edward M F LEUNG, FHKAM (Medicine), FRCP (Edin, Lond, Glasg)

Dr. Leung is currently Hon Consultant Geriatrician and Director of Geriatric Medicine Centre (Healthy Ageing) of Hong Kong Sanatorium and Hospital. He was Head of Division of Geriatric Medicine and Rehabilitation of United Christian Hospital till 2015, Ex-Chairman of Geriatric Specialty Board of Hong Kong College of Physicians, Hon Associate Professor of Department of Medicine, Chinese University of Hong Kong, Hon Associate Professor of Department of Medicine and Department of Social Work and Social Administration of University of Hong Kong. He is also President of Hong Kong Association of Gerontology and Hong Kong Continence Society. He has been Chief Editor of Hong Kong Journal of Gerontology and Geriatrics.

Dr. Leung is council member of International Association of Gerontology and the Asia/Oceania Region of IAG. He also served as convenor of the Scientific Subcommittee of Clinical Medicine of the Asia/Oceania Region of IAG. Dr. Leung has been invited to lecture in symposium held in Korea, Japan, Singapore, Australia, China, Macau and Taiwan.

Dr. Leung's major research interests are epidemiology in old age, health promotion, End of Life care, osteoporosis, fall, stroke, incontinence, long term care and public policy in old age. He is a major advocate in promoting End of Life Care for Older People in Community and Residential Care since 2007. Dr. Leung published widely in local and international journals and has been contributor to a number of books on health and ageing.

Dr. Leung has served on various boards and bodies in Hong Kong and internationally in the International Association of Gerontology and Asia Pacific Advisory Board on Continence Care. He is also founding member of Hong Kong Osteoporosis Foundation.



Professor WONG Kam-sing, GBS, JP Chairman, Wu Zhi Qiao (Bridge to China) Charitable Foundation

Professor Wong is currently Distinguished Department of Architecture Fellow at The University of Hong Kong, Honorary Professor at Hong Kong Chu Hai College, and Chairman of Wu Zhi Qiao (Bridge to China) Charitable Foundation. Since the 1990s, Wong has become a registered architect and developed expertise on sustainable architecture. He also volunteered in community service as the Founder Chairman of the Environment and Sustainable Development Committee of the Hong Kong Institute of Architects, Chairman of the Professional Green Building Council, Vice Chairman of the Hong Kong Green Building Council, etc. In 2012-22, he was appointed as the Secretary for the Environment, Hong Kong SAR Government. During his ten-year tenure as the Secretary for the Environment, he launched a number of sustainability policy blueprints on climate action, energy saving, air quality, popularisation of electric vehicles, waste management, and biodiversity, leading Hong Kong towards carbon neutrality.



Dr CHEUNG Tin-cheung, SBSChairman, Hong Kong Green Building Council

Dr CHEUNG is the Chairman of the Hong Kong Green Building Council. He is also an Honorary Professor at Hong Kong Polytechnic University, and an Adjunct Professor at the Technological and Higher Education Institute of Hong Kong.

Dr CHEUNG holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Estate Management from the University of Reading, UK, a Master of Science Degree in Construction Management from the University of Bath, UK, and a Doctor of Philosophy Degree in Fire Engineering from the City University of Hong Kong. He has professional qualifications in building surveying, property management and facility management. He is a Fellow of the Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors, a Registered Professional Surveyor (BS), and an Honorary Fellow of the Hong Kong Institute of Facility Management.

Dr CHEUNG was previously Director of Buildings in the HKSAR Government and received the Silver Bauhinia Star Award in 2019 for his dedicated and meritorious service to the Government, particularly in promoting building safety and a sustainable built environment in Hong Kong.
